Section 4: Point of Order

30. B *The question had not been started, therefore, it need not be reread.*
31. B *Section XII.1; this is a valid point of order for a quizzer to make.*

32. A *Implied from Sections XII.5 and XIV.D.1.c.*
 33. B *Section XII.5; this is a valid point of order for a coach to make; it would not be valid for a quizzer.*

Section 5: Coach's Appeal

34. B *Section XIII.B.5; the judges only consult if the first vote is not unanimous.*
 35. B *Section XIII.B.3, a coach may not appeal help or hindrance based on the actions of his own team.*
 36. B *Section: XIII.B.1; an appeal cannot be initiated after a time-out. The quizmaster should always take care to allow for appeals or points of order prior to granting a timeout or closing the match.*

Section 6: Judging Answers Correct/Incorrect

37. Correct *See Section IV.A.5*
 Reason: Revelation is incorrect information, but given after all required correct information was given.
 38. Incorrect *See Section IV.B.2*
 Reason: Acts is incorrect information given prior to completion of required information.
 39. Incorrect *See Section IV.B.5*
 Reason: The question must be completed before the answer is given for an interrupted question.
 40. Correct *See Sections IV.A.2 and IV.A.5*
 Reason: All correct information given before any repetition.
 41. Incorrect *See Section IV.B.3*
 Reason: The word "the" is repeated.
 42. Correct *See Section IV.C.1*
 Reason: Only one answer required because this is an 'or' question.
 43. Judgment *See Sections IV.A.1 and IV.A.3*
 Reason: If 'desert' is ruled the same in essence as 'wilderness' and the 'uhhs' are disregarded, then the answer could be ruled as correct.
 44. Incorrect *See Section IV.B.2*
 Reason: Incorrect information given first.
 45. Correct *See Section IV.A.5*
 Reason: Correct information given first.
 46. Correct *See Section XV.B, "Note"*
 Reason: Stating the Bible version is optional.
 47. Correct *See Section III.G*
 Reason: If interruption is not called, the quizzer is not required to complete the question.
 48. Judgment *See Section IV.A.4*
 Reason: If in the opinion of the quizmaster, the response was clearly intended to be "Psalms", then it would be ruled correct.
 49. Judgment *See Sections IV.A.3 and IV.B.5*

Reasons: The judge will have to determine whether "world" is the same, in essence, as "universe" (most quizmasters probably rule that "no"). The fact that the quizzer said "universe" after answering the question correctly is not germane since the question must be completed in essence PRIOR to any part of the answer being given.

50. Correct *See Section IV.A.5*

Reasons: The correct answer was given first, any extraneous information is disregarded.
