Rehoboam the son of Solomon became king after Solomon, but Rehoboam did not treat the people well and ten of the twelve tribes of Israel rebelled and formed their own kingdom. After Solomon's death the Israelites divided into the Kingdoms of Israel and Judah. The southern kingdom of Judah was ruled by Rehoboam and in the northern kingdom of Israel the people chose Jeroboam to be their king. Jeroboam established idol worship in the northern kingdom of Israel so the people wouldn't go to Jerusalem to offer sacrifices. He feared that if the people went to Jerusalem, they might follow Rehoboam because Jerusalem was in his kingdom of Judah.

A few kings later there arose a prophet of God named Elijah when the evil king and queen of Israel were Ahab and Jezebel. King Ahab worshiped the false god of Baal, and he made a challenge to Elijah to see which god was greater the God of Israel or Baal. They built an altar with a sacrifice on it and took turns praying to their god to consume the sacrifice. The Baal prophets went first and prayed all day long and nothing happened. Then Elijah prayed and God came down an consumed the sacrifice and the rock altar with fire, God did this so that all of Israel would know hat God was really God.

Well Elijah was prophet for many years and through God did many amazing things. When it came time for him to step down, God came and took Elijah directly to heaven in a whirlwind, his successor was Elisha which witness God taking Elijah. Elisha and Elijah have similar names the difference is a j and sh, j comes before s just as Elijah comes before Elisha.

Elisha through God performed many great miracles as well and became famous. A Syrian officer name Naaman came to him for healing of a bad skin disease called leprosy and Elisha told him from behind his house door to wash in the muddy Jordan River and he would be healed. Reluctantly he did it and God healed him. Another famous miracle during this time was for king Hezekiah where God caused the sun to move backwards to show that God had healed him

After a long time of kings who did not serve God, God allowed Judah to be taken captive by the city of Babylon. Jeremiah was a prophet when they were conquered and wrote many sad things about this bad experience and because of this he is known as the weeping prophet. King Nebuchadnezzar ruled Babylon and he later took not just Judah but Jerusalem as well. They took many of the young men like Daniel as slaves. Daniel became famous when he interpreted a dream for King Nebuchadnezzar.

Persia later conquered Babylon and that is where the story of Esther comes from. Esther was the Jewish girl who became the wife of the king of Persia. Queen Esther was an important part of God's plan to save the Jewish people.

After 70 years in captivity God's people were freed to return to Jerusalem. Zerubbabel was one of the first to return and with God's help he oversaw the rebuilding of the temple of God in Jerusalem. A few years later God called another man named Nehemiah to go back to Jerusalem and rebuild the walls of the city for protection and he did.

### GO-WORD is God, Bible (13)

The Bible tells us to be Christ-like and there are several verses we use for guidelines. The Golden Rule is found in Matthew 7:12 "Do to others whatever you would like them to do to you.". In Philippians it expresses what the Christian's attitude should be toward both life and death: Philippians 1:21 For to me, living means living for Christ, and dying is even better.

The Bible not only tells how to live but how to avoid trouble with others: Proverbs 15:1 A gentle answer deflects anger, but harsh words make tempers flare.

The **Bible** tells how to deal with authorities like schoolteachers, police officers and other government authorities: We should obey them because their authority comes from God. Not only should we obey just them but people in the church like Sunday-school teachers, pastors, and other church leaders even quiz coaches, because they are responsible to God for our souls.

The **Bible** tells us it is not a sin to be tempted, because even Jesus was tempted and did not sin. The **Bible** does help with temptation in that it tells us three of the most common forms in 1 John 2:16 For the world offers only a craving for physical pleasure, a craving for everything we see, and pride in our achievements and possessions.

#### To repeat them:

- 1. Craving for physical pleasure
- 2. Craving for everything we see.
- 3. Pride

The three main sources of temptation are found in

- 1. Matthew 4:1 Jesus was ... tempted there by the devil
- 2. John 16:33 In the world you will have many trials
- 3. James 1:14 Temptation comes from our own desires

Or more simply

- 1. The Devil
- 2. The World (John 16:33)
- 3. Our own desires. (James 1:14)

Prayer is talking to God. Intercession means to pray to God for someone else. Intercede means to do something on another's behalf or for someone else. Hebrews 7:25 tells us the Holy Spirit intercedes with God on our behalf or for us. In Romans 8:26 the Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness because the main weakness of our prayers is we don't know what God wants us to pray for.

Lastly the Bible instructs to not marry a person who is not a Christian, because God's Word says in 2 Corinthians 5:14 Don't team up with those who are unbelievers.
