161 - Who was called the weeping prophet?

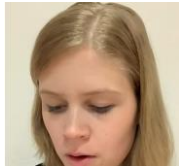

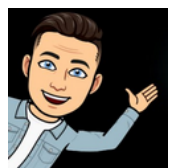

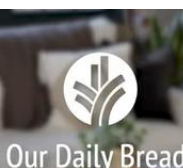

Matthew 7:12 "Do to others whatever you would like them to do to you."

Philippians 1:21 For to me, living means living for Christ, and dying is even better.

_ Craving for everything we see

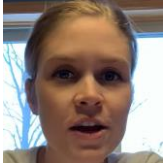
_ Pride [in our achievements and possessions]

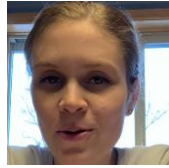

530 > QUOTATION QUESTION. What should be our **greatest** goal in life?

Matthew 6:33 "Seek the Kingdom of God above all else, and live righteously, and he will give you everything you need."

531 > What does the Bible say to do when others pressure us to disobey God?

__Do not follow others to do what is wrong.

__Obey God rather than human authority.

532 > QUOTATION QUESTION. Quote the Lord's Prayer.

Matthew 6:9-13 "Our Father in heaven, may your name be kept holy. May your Kingdom come soon. May your will be done on earth, as it is in heaven. Give us today the food we need, and forgive us our sins, as we have forgiven those who sin against us. And don't let us yield to temptation, but rescue us from the evil one."
