Early in the new church the apostles were preaching in the Jewish temple and converting so many to Jesus that the High Priests became jealous and had them arrested, beaten and shamed. This did not stop them but only made them more determined to work for Jesus because they were counted it worthy to suffer disgrace for the name of Jesus

The Apostle Peter was a great leader in the early church, he raised Tabitha from the dead in answer to prayer. There was the Roman officer Cornelius who sent for Peter to come and preach to him. While Peter was preaching at Cornelius's house the Holy Spirit fell upon all who were listening to the message, they were all saved, filled with the Holy Spirit, and baptized in water. Once King Herod arrested Peter and was going to kill him for preaching. Other Christians began to pray, and an angel opened the prison for Peter and freed him.

Eventually the persecution of the new church went beyond beatings, and many were killed or martyred for being a Christian. History tells all but one of the Apostles were martyred for preaching the Good News and that was John who wrote a gospel, three epistles and the book of Revelation. The first person to be martyred for being a Christian was Stephen and early convert of the new church.

Saul of Tarsus was there when Stephen was killed, and he worked hard to arrest many Christians. While Saul was on the road to Damascus to arrest Christians, Jesus appeared to him in a light from heaven, and Saul accepted Him as Lord. God changed Saul's name to Paul when he was converted. Paul became a leader in the new Church and went on to write 13 books of the Bible, more than any other person. Paul went on three missionary journeys; the first Barnabas went with him. When they were preaching in Antioch people first called Jesus' followers Christians. In Lystra many people thought Paul was a God because of miracles God performed through him. The people of Lystra stoned him and left him for dead, but God healed him. On Paul's 2nd missionary journey his chief helpers were Silas and Timothy. Paul and Silas were put in prison and God freed them with an earthquake, afterward Paul told the Philippian jailer how to be saved, Acts 16:31 says, "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, along with everyone in your household". It was while on this journey God showed Paul a vision of a man from Macedonia calling for help. Luke accompanied Paul on some his journeys. Luke was very smart and was a doctor by occupation, Luke also wrote the book of Acts and one of the Gospels. Paul was a tentmaker and in Corinth he became friends with fellow tentmakers Aguilla and Priscilla who assisted him in preaching.

The Bible has instructions for what we should do if we get sick, James 5:14 says "Are any of you sick? You should call for the elders of the church to come and pray over you, anointing you with oil in the name of the Lord." If prayer is offered in faith, God promises to heal in the next verse. As we learned in the last lesson Jesus sacrifice is the source of our healing.

When Jesus ascended into heaven he promised to return, and the return of Jesus is the Christian's Blessed Hope. The Rapture is a term not found in the Bible, but it refers to when Jesus returns to take His Church-the believers both dead and living-out of this world. The time of Jesus' return or the Rapture is only known by God the Father. We should always be ready and expect Jesus' return, it was a promise. The coming of Jesus should not be a surprise to a Christian, because Christians do not live in the darkness. 1 Thessalonians 5:4 says, "But you are not in the dark about these things, dear brothers and sisters, and you won't be surprised when the day of the Lord comes like a thief."

Shortly after the Rapture of the church two events will happen "the judgement of Christians" and "the wedding feast of the lamb"

There will also be a Great Tribulation which is a period of extreme trouble and turmoil before the final judgement. The Antichrist is a man who will rule the world during the Great Tribulation and will attempt to make all people worship him as God.

The Millennium is a future period of one thousand years when Jesus shall rule over the earth. During the Millennium Satan will be imprisoned in a bottomless pit so that he cannot tempt people.

At the conclusion of the millennium Satan will be loosed from the bottomless pit, and Christ Jesus will completely conquer him and his followers.

Hebrews 9:27 says "And just as each person is destined to die once and after that comes judgment,". There are two appointments all people will keep, and they are Death and Judgement. We will all die and after death we will all be judged by God.
