



Not all disciples are apostles, but all apostles are disciples. A disciple is defined as a follower of Jesus and **an apostle is a special messenger sent by God**. There were 12 apostles but many disciples of Jesus. When Jesus left earth, he commanded his 12 apostles to make disciples of all nations.

The teachings from the Bible are called doctrine and it is the guide we use to make disciples. The doctrine of faith is our shield and **faith is belief and complete trust in God**.

Sin entered the world through the disobedience of Adam and Eve and ever since we have been under sin's curse. John 3:4 tells us sin is breaking **God's** law and is contrary to the law of **God**. James 4:17 tells us, knowing to do good and not doing it is sin. In combining the two **sin is defined as refusing to do God's will as revealed by His Word and His Spirit**. Death is the separation of the body and the soul, and death is the penalty of sin.

God has a plan of salvation and gives it to us with grace. Grace means that **God** offers us His love and forgiveness as a gift and not because we earned it or deserve it. We are saved from sin by the gracious gift of **God** in sending his son Jesus to die for our sins. **We call the price Jesus paid for our salvation redemption**.

In order to be saved we must accept **God's** gracious gift of redemption, with faith and with repentance. **Repentance means having a change of mind, heart, and direction**. With our acceptance of **God's** gift, and repentance of our heart, **God** accepts us as though we had not sinned which is justification. After **God's** acceptance comes sanctification which is being separated from sin and set apart to serve **God**. **God** works through all this with us by the power of the Holy Spirit.

After we are saved, prayer, praise and worship to **God** become a big part of our life. **Prayer is talking to God** and 1 Thessalonians 5:17 tells us to "Never stop praying." Praise and worship are very close to the same thing and the wording very similar, so it is important to learn it like a quotation question. **Worship is exalting and adoring God for who he is**. **Praise is expressing our love for God for all He is and all He has done**. Worship is from the heart and Praise is action. Worship is exalting God for who He is, and Praise is for all He is and has done. When Jesus was born the **angels, which are spiritual being created by God** sang praises to **God** above the shepherds. The wise men when they found Jesus bowed and gave gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh in worship to **God's** son.

One thing you can count on is that **God is immutable, which means he does not change, He is always the same**. That can be reassuring to know **God** is with us to the end and all we learn from Bible doctrine is immutable, **God** and the doctrine of the Bible does not change it.

When a Christian dies his soul and spirit go immediately to be with the Lord. 2 Corinthians 5:8 says "We are confident, yes, well pleased rather to be absent from the body and to be present with the Lord." We learn from Jesus' story of Lazarus and the rich that both the righteous and the wicked are conscious after death.

The Bible also promises one day our earthly bodies will be resurrected when Jesus returns. One of the first promises is in Job 19:26 "...After my dead body has decayed yet in my body, I will see God!"

Jesus told us in John 5:28-29 both the righteous and the wicked will be resurrected, the righteous to receive eternal life and the wicked to receive eternal punishment.

1 Corinthians 15 is known as the resurrection chapter. It is called the resurrection chapter because Paul emphasizes the importance of Jesus' death and resurrection. Verse 14 says if Christ has not been resurrected then all our preaching and faith are useless. In 1 Corinthians 15, Paul also explains the resurrection of Christian and likens it to the sprouting of a new plant from a seed.

The word Rapture is not found in the Bible but it is used to describe where all the Christians who have died will be resurrected. There are over three hundred references in the New Testament to the second coming of Christ. Jesus tells us the age or time of His return will be like the days of Noah and Lot.

Christ's revelation is another part of the second coming of Christ. Christ's revelation is His return to earth to rule and reign for one thousand years following the great tribulation. The second coming of Christ is comprised of two events, the rapture and Christ's revelation.

In spite of all these warnings and prophecies there will still be those who claim to be Christians that are unprepared for His return. Jesus' parable of the Five Wise and Five Foolish Bridesmaids tells us that some who claim to be Christians will be unprepared for His return. Are you prepared?
