What is the Bible? (16-1-10s)

The Bible's definition can be defined in three ways:

- 1> The Bible is the God's inspired Word.
- 2> The Bible is the God's revelation to all people of himself.
- 3> The Bible is the God's plan of salvation for all people.

By inspired Word we mean God gave the writers each Word of the Bible, not just the thoughts and ideas. God's revelation means God shows us who he is. In the Old Testament God's plan of salvation was to give an animal blood sacrifice for our sins. In the New Testament God's plan of salvation was to give his son Jesus as blood sacrifice for our sin.

The Bible is not just one book but is composed of sixty-six books and the Bible is divided into two divisions the Old and New Testament; testament means covenant, contract, or agreement. The Old Testament contains 39 books. The New Testament contains 27 books. The Bible was written by about forty different people over a period of 1600 years.

The Bible was not written in English the language we speak today. The Old Testament was written in Hebrew and the New Testament was written in Greek; both were translated to English later. Therefore, we have many different versions of the Bible in English. They all are the true Word of God just translated differently to help people to understand the meaning of the original text.

The first book of the Bible which tells us about the beginning of the world, is Genesis. Genesis is part of the Pentateuch which is another name for the first five books of the Bible written by Moses. The Old Testament of thirty-nine books are divided into four sections, Law (5 books), History (12 books), Poetry (5 books), and Prophets (17 books). In the five books of Poetry is the book of Psalms which is the longest book in the Bible with 150 chapters and is a collection of hymns and songs.

The New Testament begins with the four gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. Gospel means "Good News" and the theme of the four gospels is the life and teachings of Jesus. After the four gospels we have the book of Acts which tells us about the beginnings of the Early Church. After Acts we come to the thirteen books written by Paul who wrote more books in the Bible than any other person. The last book of the Bible is Revelation, and it is composed almost entirely of prophecies of the future.

God's Bible (16-1-20s)

God gave us the Bible. The Holy Spirit inspired holy men, giving then both the truth and the words to write. He verbally inspired over 40 different people which means God inspired each word not just the thoughts and ideas. There are over 2,500 times where the Bible states "and God said" or the same, which tells us God inspired the Bible.

The Bible is true or infallible which means it cannot fail and has no errors. Jesus taught by telling parables which is a story about familiar things which helps us understand spiritual truths. After one of Jesus' parables about the "Good Shepherd", Jesus made a statement which tells us the Bible will last forever he said "Heaven and earth will disappear, but my Words will never disappear" Matthew 24:35.

The Bible is also important to commit to memory, in Psalm 119:11 it says, "I have hidden your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you." It is not just words in our mind but the understanding of the words in our heart that helps us to avoid sin by memorizing Bible verses. I encourage you all to take up the Quotation Challenge and memorize all 96 Quotation Questions.

Other fun facts about the Bible: Paul wrote more books of the Bible than any other person. Moses wrote the first five books of the Bible referred to as the Books of Law or the Pentateuch. There are seventeen books by the prophets in the Bible with a major part written by four men Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, and Isaiah. These four men can be easily remembered as the first letter of each of their names makes up the acronym J.E.D.I. "Jedi". There were only two apostles Matthew and John, who wrote a Gospel; the other two were written by followers after Jesus' death. One more fact about the Bible, 1 Corinthians chapter thirteen is known as the love chapter. I always think of this as the "unlucky at love" chapter because of the superstition over the number thirteen.

The Bible is the inspired Word of God and is our authoritative rule of faith and conduct. Meaning: The Bible has the right to command us in what we believe and what we do.
