Story (Psalm 119:105-112)

- ⁹ How can a young person stay pure? By obeying your word.
- ¹⁰ I have tried hard to find you—
 don't let me wander from your commands.
- ¹¹ I have hidden your word in my heart, that I might not sin against you.
- ¹² I praise you, O LORD; teach me your decrees.
- ¹³ I have recited aloud
- all the regulations you have given us.
- ¹⁴ I have rejoiced in your laws as much as in riches.
- ¹⁵ I will study your commandments and reflect on your ways.
- ¹⁶ I will delight in your decrees and not forget your word.

Psalm 119 is the longest chapter in the longest book in the Bible. There are 176 verses and it is divided into sections, one for each letter of the Hebrew alphabet. Psalm 119:11 falls in the section for the 2nd letter. The chapter is about God's law/God's Word and was written as a reminder of the importance of God's Word.

We are focusing on Psalm 119:11 and it helps understand why memorizing God's Word is important. If we have God's Word in our heart, understand and memorized it will help us not do bad things or sin.

Memorizing God's word is something God has told us to do.
