Always: constantly, repeatedly, ever, eternally

Same: constant, unchanging, unaltered

Yesterday: past, before,

Today: now, present

Forever: endless, always, eternally, permanently

## Story (Hebrews 13:1-9)

Keep on loving each other as brothers and sisters. <sup>2</sup> Don't forget to show hospitality to strangers, for some who have done this have entertained angels without realizing it! <sup>3</sup> Remember those in prison, as if you were there yourself. Remember also those being mistreated, as if you felt their pain in your own bodies.

<sup>4</sup> Give honor to marriage and remain faithful to one another in marriage. God will surely judge people who are immoral and those who commit adultery.

<sup>5</sup> Don't love money; be satisfied with what you have. For God has said,

"I will never fail you. I will never abandon you."

<sup>6</sup> So we can say with confidence,

"The LORD is my helper, so I will have no fear. What can mere people do to me?"<sup>[c]</sup>

<sup>7</sup> Remember your leaders who taught you the word of God. Think of all the good that has come from their lives and follow the example of their faith.
