Story in the Bible with Reference:

Proverbs 6:17-19 lists things God despises, such as a proud look, a lying tongue, and hands that shed innocent blood.

Salvation Connection:

Understanding what God hates helps us to avoid these sins and live in a way that is pleasing to Him, following Jesus' example of righteousness.

Discussion Questions:

- 1. Why does God hate these things?
- 2. How can we avoid doing things that God hates?
- 3. What are some positive actions we can take instead?

Bible Club Awards

Quizzers will be asked questions in the same fashion as if they were in a quiz match, but they are not required to activate any equipment or be identified before responding. Their response should be evaluated using the same criteria used in a quiz match (for detail please reference the official JBQ guidelines).

The person administering the test must not be an immediate family member to the person being tested. Breaks, for study, between the first and last questions are not allowed. Each test should be administered in one complete sitting and only one test may be administered per day.

To pass quizzers must get ____% questions answered correctly per testing.

Bible Club Awards are designed like the National Bible Award but using a quarter of the questions from each point value. After completing a point value, they can test for the National Bible Awards Discoverer, Searcher, Achiever, and Master and should pass.



Most area competitions run on a 4-meet cycle proceeding through the Bible Fact-Pak a quarter of the box at a time. Each plan is broken into quarters to make this easier, the units in most cases will be weeks. This guide is designed to help develop your study plan for the year. Use the quarters to test your kids to prepare them for the National Bible Awards. <u>https://ibq.ag.org/BibleMaster</u>. Joining a local competition is usually best but having internal church competition can work with as little as 4 children.
